Thanks to an investment by the Canadian government, the Canadian Institute for Research on Linguistic Minorities (CIRLM) was created in 2002 to meet a need for research on official language minorities in Canada. The young Institute is proud to present its third annual report. Its dynamic accomplishments bode well for the future of research on linguistic minorities in Canada. The CIRLM fills the need for academic research, as well as for applied research that has a direct impact on the communities and stakeholders concerned about the fate of official language minorities. With its partnership based approach to research, the Institute plays an essential upstream role in research by encouraging ties between researchers and communicating information on research opportunities. 6.3.3 Web site

The CIRLM's Web site is still evolving. Changes are aimed at improving the presentation of information and increasing the information available on the Web site. Several publications are now available on the CIRLM's Web site. It now has a search engine to find references to the publications in the directory. This search engine will be improved, expanding possibilities for searching the Web site. Work is under way to introduce those researchers associated with the CIRLM and to disseminate publications (works, theses and briefs) on linguistic minorities. Little by little, these improvements should make the Web site a reference tool for all those who are interested in official language minorities in Canada. The Web site is also linked to a newsletter that regularly presents information on the CIRLM's activities.

6.3.4 Media

Some of the CIRLM's work and projects drew media attention. Rodrigue Landry's study, "*Libérer le potentiel caché de l'exogamie*", led to several interviews published in newspapers and broadcast on radio and television in several provinces. Rodrigue Landry appeared on Marie-France Bazzo's program, *Indicatif présent*, to discuss the fate of Francophone minorities outside Québec. Daniel Bourgeois' work also garnered media attention. His study "*Vers la pleine gestion francophone en milieu minoritaire*", gave rise to several media reports. His two other research projects funded by the SSHRC were publicized in the media. He also
