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## **1 MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR**

This is the fourth annual report of the Canadian Institute for Research on Linguistic Minorities (CIRLM), now in its fourth year of existence. The Institute was established in 2002 through an endowment funded by the Canadian government. Its mission is to meet the need for research on official language minorities in Canada. The Institute makes an important contribution to promoting fundamental and applied research on Canada's linguistic minorities and its dissemination within the academic community as well as to governments, community organizations and the general public.

The Institute is becoming an important clearing house for researchers working in the field of linguistic minorities. In addition to being the architect of several research projects, as can be seen in this annual report, the CIRLM also strives to create the conditions that will stimulate research on linguistic minorities. For example, with its partners, it makes grant-giving bodies and governments aware of the need to better understand linguistic minorities and to allocate resources for this purpose. The partnership-based approach in research and the network of associate researchers appears to be effective at stimulating research on minority official language communities. The Institute also transmits information on opportunities for research and dissemination of knowledge on linguistic minorities.

In addition, the Institute's involvement in organizing activities to disseminate knowledge in both academic and community environments gives it an important role in transferring knowledge on minorities. The Institute helps not only to advance scientific knowledge of the situation experienced by official language



minorities in Canada, but also to shed light on the action of those concerned by the fate of these communities.

I would like to underline the high-calibre work of Rodrigue Landry, the Institute's Executive Director, who, with his team, has established the conditions and assembled the resources needed to accomplish the mission of the CIRLM.

I invite you to read about the accomplishments of the CIRLM and judge them for yourselves.

## 2 MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

I am proud to present you with a review of the accomplishments of the Canadian Institute for Research on Linguistic Minorities for 2005–2006. This year saw the consolidation and development of the CIRLM's activities. The CIRLM owes the success of its accomplishments to the partnerships that it has developed and continues to develop, with associate researchers and organizations, thus creating a multiplier effect for the Institute's research and knowledge transfer activities. The consolidation of its partnerships forms the core of the CIRLM's strategy. The Institute is strengthening its links while broadening them in a strategic manner in order to cover its main research areas, namely, (1) identity, (2) early childhood, youth and the family, (3) the vitality of communities, (4) health and (5) governance.

The year 2005–2006 was also a transition year marked by a number of changes: in fall 2005 Daniel Bourgeois, whose research focused on public policies, left the Institute; the secretary-receptionist was replaced by a full-time administrative assistant; Marc Johnson was hired as a part-time researcher located in Ottawa; and finally, Cristophe Traisnel was recently hired as a researcher in the field of political science.

Marc Johnson is a researcher who is well positioned in the network of applied research on official language minorities, whether for government or community organizations. He also participates in several fundamental research projects involving linguistic minorities. His experience will help to consolidate the CIRLM's position in the field of applied research. Cristophe Traisnel is a young researcher in the field



of political science who has already made a number of significant contributions on the topic of minorities. He will make an important contribution in the political analysis of official language minorities.

This transition period has had an impact on the administrative activities of the CIRML which, beyond its everyday management tasks, has devoted energy to the recruitment of new researchers. However, as readers of this annual report will soon realize, the Institute was nevertheless able to carry out several research and dissemination projects. With its new team, the CIRLM is clearly entering the coming period with optimism.

Though the CIRLM is a young institute, the context in which its research evolves has changed. The efforts made by its many partners to include the theme of official languages in the grant programs of the country's major granting agencies have begun to show results. Programs on official languages have been created within the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada. Through its participation in several research programming committees for governments or their agencies and community organizations, the CIRLM helps to put the issue of linguistic minorities on research and survey agendas. Statistics Canada's post-censal survey,

which will be conducted in 2006, will reflect research concerns related to the situation of the country's official language minorities. The CIRLM has actively participated in developing this survey.

The imminent creation of the Research Data Centre (RDC) is yet another example of the leadership of the CIRLM, which brought together the partners needed to establish the Centre. Located in Moncton, the RDC will make a significant contribution to the use and dissemination of the data produced by Statistic Canada's major surveys. It will meet the specific needs of research on official language minorities.

I invite you to read about the accomplishments of the CIRLM. I also wish to thank the Board of Directors for their interest and vision, the programming committee for its invaluable advice and support, the Institute's entire team for their commitment and conscientious work and, finally, all our collaborators, without whom the CIRLM would not be able to fulfill its mission.

# 6 2005-2006 ACTIVITIES
